WebAssign Homework Submission

1. Go to <http://www.webassign.net> Click on “Log In” button
2. Enter your USER NAME : 224 + the first 5 letters of your last name (no spaces)

Example: Joe Smithson has user name: 224smith
 Jane Doe has user name: 224doe (less than 5, full name)

3. Enter your INSTITUTION: emich
4. Enter your PASSWORD: the last 4 digits of your student EMU number. [You can change your password if you wish, but don't forget the new one! I have no access to a new password so you would not be able to make homework submissions.]

Example: Student E999876543 has a password 6543
 Student E999000102 has a password 102 (leading zeros dropped)

5. Click on the SUBMIT button.
6. This will take you to a page with your name on the top, class information, and announcements.
7. You will be asked to register soon in September in the announcements. To register you must purchase an access card online through WebAssign. You may use WebAssign for now (and for the next few days) without registering. If you don't register, you can't do the homework and you will lose points. A lot of points.
8. When I make the announcement in class, click on Assignment #1, print it out, and get started. You should write out the problems and submit your answers later. You don't have to stay connected to WebAssign as you work on the problems. Submit your answers after you have made some progress. Your answers will be graded immediately. There is no limit on the number of submissions you may have, except for multiple-choice problems, of course. This is to encourage you to work the problems early and often! If your answers are incorrect, rework the problems carefully then resubmit. Your last submission will determine your score for the assignment. Don't wait until close to the deadline to start the homework; you will not have time to complete the assignment and you will lose a significant number of points. **Note: Be sure to save your written work as you can use it to study for the exams.**
